Stop all exclusion! Social rights for all!

First of all, welcome to Freiburg! You have probably come a long way. You are here to find protection and build a new life. You are living in Landeserstaufnahmeeinrichtung (LEA) Freiburg. Here you are denied basic rights.

> You have to eat in the canteen. The food is not healthy and often not enough. We say: Everyone has the right to cook for themselves!

> You need permission to go to the doctor. Often authorities deny medical treatment. We say: Everyone has the right to health care!

> You share a room with many people. You can't lock the room. You have no peace. We say: Everyone has the right to their own home!

> You get money from the state. Maybe you want to work. But you are not allowed to work. We say: Everyone has the right to earn their own money!

> You might work for 80 cents an hour. The minimum wage in Germany is 12€ per hour. We say: Everyone has the right to a fair wage!

> You don't get a paper saying how much money you get and for what. You probably get too little money. We say: Everyone has the right to get money according to the minimum subsistence level!

What you can do

Money: In Germany there is a special law for refugees: the *Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz*. This law says how much money you get from the state per month. Single people get 410€ per month. But you only get a small part in cash. This is because you eat in the canteen and get clothes. These costs are deducted from the 410€. According to the law, you get a paper that says exactly how much money you get and for what. This paper is called Leistungsbescheid.

We know: If you live in the LEA, you don't get this paper. That is a problem! Because you probably get too little money. If you get too little money, you can appeal. This means that you do not agree with the calculation of the money. The authorities must then check the calculation. If the calculation was wrong, you will get money back. We can help you to get a *Leistungsbescheid*. We can help you to appeal.

Work in the camps: In the LEA and in other camps, many people work for 80 cents per hour. This is also part of the Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz. Nobody in Germany works for so little money. The minimum wage is $12 \in$ per hour. We are sure: a wage of 80 cents per hour is against national and international law.

To change the law it is necessary to go to court. Only affected people can go to court, that is, people who work or have worked for 80 cents per hour. A court case against the law takes a long time. Nevertheless, it is important that people go to court! That's how we can make a change. We can help you to go to court against the law.
